What is the Hope Center?



 The Hope Center for Families is an initiative of the Omega **Community Development** Corporation (CDC) to empower individuals and families of greater Dayton to achieve and sustain self-sufficiency with the life skills, work skills, and character to succeed through a two-generational poverty reduction model.



- Omega CDC: Guiding families to essential resources
- Services offered:
 - Food Outreach
 - Workforce Development
 - Afterschool Programming
 - Family Coaching
 - Maternal Support
 - Senior Lofts







- Dayton Children's Hospital: Enhancing child health outcomes
 - Priority given to Hope Zone Residents, Mini U. students.
 - Only new patients accepted are Hope Zone residents.
 - Regular Checkup Appointments
 - Lactation Specialist



- Mini University: Supporting early childhood education
- Families referred to MVCDC or Omega CDC based on initial needs assessments.
- DCH's Speech Therapy and Occupational Therapy services are available on site.
 - 25-30% of the children who initially received services no longer need them.







- Sinclair Community College:
- Morning and evening classes offered.
- Some of the classes offered are:
 - Basic Life Support Training for Healthcare Provider
 - Nurse Aide Training
 - Heartsaver First Aid, CPR, & AED
- CCAMPIS Grants
 - CCAMPIS (Child Care Access Means Parents in School) Grants may be available for students who qualify.



- MVCDC: Therapeutic Intervention Program
- Dayton Children's Hospital (DCH) gives priority to TIP Classroom students
- Referrals sent from Mini U to TIP Classroom.
- Family reunification


